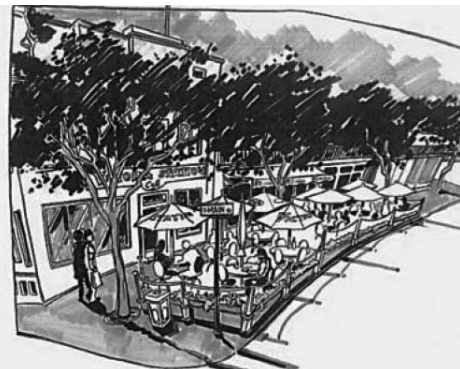

On **Mark Erelli's** latest album, 'Hope & Other Casualties' (March 2006 on Signature Sounds Recordings), he raises the bar with an unapologetic and timeless collection of deeply personal and affecting songs. Effortlessly balancing songs of love and protest, resignation and redemption, *Hope* is a brave and searingly honest tour de force which cements Erelli's reputation as one of today's

best young singer/songwriters. Erelli proudly wears his heart on his sleeve, weaving tales of honest and true passion. But unlike the flotilla of "emo" currently controlling the airwaves, Erelli is not afraid to turn his eyes outward, and *Hope* is a committed artistic response to the questions and worries familiar to all of us today. In troubled times, we hunger for meaning. "I don't have any answers," he says. "We are all grappling with these issues, and this is my personal struggle to keep my head up in times like these." Maybe it's not cool to be earnest, and hope might not be hip. But as we all walk through our own lives, ignoring a subway bombing or a hurricane or a war until the next newscast, sunk deep in our jobs and relationships-beyond all the celebrity bling, reality TV, and other commercial distractions-Mark Erelli speaks to us in our solitary, scared, shared selves. In 2007, Mark is releasing his first all-acoustic record, a collection of lullabies and love songs called *Innocent When You Dream*. This homespun release, originally intended as a gift for friends and family, features tender, hushed renditions of songs by Wilco, Townes VanZandt, and James Taylor, among others. Throughout the year, Mark can also be seen onstage internationally as part of Warner Bros. Recording Artist Lori McKenna's band.

Saturday - 9 - Paul Geremia

For almost forty years, Paul Geremia has survived solely by the fruit of his musical labours. Having abandoned all other means of support in 1966, he has been travelling far and wide ever since, performing in every capacity from street singing to club and concert bookings, throughout the US, Canada and Europe. Through the years, Geremia has built a reputation as a first rate bluesman, songwriter, a "scholar" of early jazz and blues, and one of the best country blues fingerpickers ever with his tools - six and twelve-string guitars, harmonica, piano and a husky soulful voice - and with an innate sense of the humour as well as the drama of the music, he keeps traditional blues fresh and alive with his performances. Combining his interpretation of the earlier music of people like Blind Lemon Jefferson, Robert Johnson, Blind Willie McTell, Scrapper Blackwell and Blind Blake, with his original compositions, he has created a style which is very much his own. Geremia has recorded ten solo albums, and has appeared on numerous anthologies and compilation discs. His superb recordings have made him a critical favorite and place him firmly among the legends who inspired and influenced him over the past four decades.

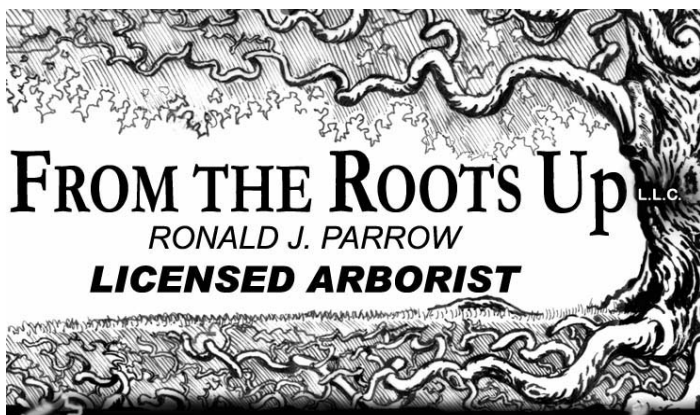

Originally from Saint Louis, **John Schindler** was influenced early on by that town's rhythm and blues and his Oklahoma mother's singing. This funky start was drastically tempered by a nine-year stint in a Catholic seminary where silence and Gregorian chant were his daily bread. After leaving the brotherhood, and armed only with his vow of poverty, John moved to New England and pursued the path of an itinerant musician, playing in sundry bands and bad barrooms. His music is memorable, poignant, hopeful, wise, and passionate. Winner of both the 2003 Boston Folk Festival Songwriting Contest & the 2006 Rose Garden Performing Songwriting Competition.



Michael Troy has been playing solo sets and supporting others with a varied showcase of his own work for over 20 years. In the past 8 years, Michael has devoted more time to his music, the results of which are collected in his debut release, "Whispers in the Wind" and his second release "Romancing the Moon." Michael will tell you he has been a mill worker, fisherman, laborer and carpenter - however he has always come back to his first love which is music.

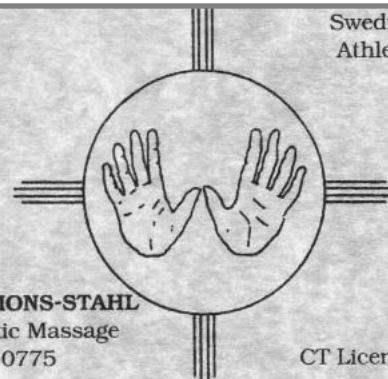

Our Pricing Practices

1. Sales Tax Included - Our prices include the 6% Connecticut Sales Tax. The prices listed on the menu are exactly what you pay. Our prices may seem to be inflated; however, a \$8.50 menu item is actually \$8.02 + \$.48 sales tax. Furthermore, this practice makes it easier for the customer, especially if that customer is a child who has exact change for a cookie. What you see is exactly what you pay - what could be simpler?

2. Not Market Standard Pricing - We are not trying to fool the customer into thinking that \$7.95 is less expensive than \$8.00. We find this type of pricing insulting to our customers. However, the reason it is used so extensively around the nation is that it works effectively. We don't like that practice, and we also like to believe that our clientele is not so easily fooled.

3. No Pennies, Dimes or Nickels - Because our prices include tax and we do not price in the standard way, we do not have to use pennies, dimes or nickels. This is a service to both the customer and to us. We don't give you lots of change, and we only have to use quarters and fifty-cent pieces. This also helps our staff to be more efficient performing transactions, which saves time and money. An added bonus is that we don't have to count change at the end of the business day.

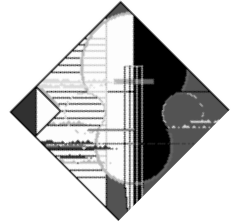
