ur sister restaurant in Putnam, 85 Main has an anniversary approaching! On June 22 it will be nine years since the doors first opened for business (6/22/05) in a newly renovated space formerly occupied by the Vine Bistro.

Opening with style, 85 Main featured a Raw Bar and was described as a New American Fusion restaurant.

The outside patio area, that was added in front 85 Main and Victoria Station, has brought attention to the restaurant and the downtown area and has helped make Putnam a destination!

In 2009, the bar area was expanded, creating a space two times the size of the original bar and large enough to accommodate a growing number of customers choosing to drink and dine in the bar. The new area featured a sushi bar designed in consultation with Chef Osaki who is now our sushi

chef. The 85 Main menu takes on new style, dimension and flavors with Chef Osaki's very beautiful creations.

85 Main is the producer of the Shuck-Off Oyster and Shellfish event. Celebrated at 85 Main for the first two years, the event grew in popularity and was moved to Rotary Park the third year.

With attendance at more than 3,000 people during the 4th annual celebration, the event highlighted our restaurant and the Putnam area to local and out of town customers.

This year, 85 Main plans to renovate the down-stairs area. The new room will resemble a wine cellar with stone walls and exposed wine storage and will be used for functions as well as for additional seating. 

As traditional Irish music and dance continue to enjoy phenomenal success both here and in Ireland, Aine Minogue is an artist who has long explored its









Internationally recognized singer and songwriter, **Kevin Briody** has shared the stage with talented



artists ranging from Art Garfunkel to Aimee Mann. Briody earned two Emmy Awards in Best Original Song - in 2008, with "Little Starr" a tune that also earned him a BMI Film & Television Award and

in 2009, with "We All Fall Down." Briody has released four CDs to date: "When No One's Watching", a Music Row DISCovery Award winner; "Familiar", produced with help from a National Endowment for the Arts Artist Fellowship Grant; "Buddy Up", a tribute to his Dixieland jazz trombone-playing father; and "The Gathering: A Christmas Collection." The CT Special Olympic Summer Games opened with Briody's song "We're All Heroes" and national organization Autism Speaks commissioned his song "Bring Them Back" to help raise awareness. Briody served as CT's Official State Troubadour from 2000-2002 and was named a Master Teaching Artist by the Connecticut Commission on Culture & Tourism. He teaches songwriting workshops to aspiring songwriters of all ages.





Our Pricing Practices

- 1. Sales Tax Included Our prices include the 6.35% Connecticut Sales Tax. The prices listed on the menu are exactly what you pay. Our prices may seem to be inflated; however, a \$10.00 menu item is actually \$9.40 + \$.60 sales tax. Furthermore, this practice makes it easier for the customer, especially if that customer is a child who has exact change for a cookie. What you see is exactly what you pay what could be simpler?
- 2. Not Market Standard Pricing We are not trying to fool the customer into thinking that \$9.95 is less expensive than \$10.00. We find this type of pricing insulting to our customers. However, the reason it is used so extensively around the nation is that it works effectively. We don't like that practice, and we also like to believe that our clientele is not so easily fooled.
- 3. No Pennies, Dimes or Nickels Because our prices include tax and we do not price in the standard way, we do not have to use pennies, dimes or nickels. This is a service to both the customer and to us. We don't give you lots of change, and we only have to use quarters and fifty-cent pieces. This also helps our staff to be more efficient performing transactions, which saves time and money. An added bonus is that we don't have to count change at the end of the business day.
